The Surveyor pays homage to John Riddoch Rymill, who led the British Graham Land Expedition to Antarctica in 1934-37, where he surveyed the Antarctic Peninsula.

Aroma

Rich ripe blackberries, boysenberry, and exotic spice, balanced by smoky, vanilla French oak.

Palate

Deep, driving black forest fruits and brooding spice. Cased in beautiful oak notes of baking spices, fresh roast coffee and dark chocolate.

Concentrated fruit balanced against bold oak to provide a presence, length, and intensity. An excellent depth of complexity that will reward patient cellaring, this is a prime example of our flagship Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon

Food matching

Perfect with a slow grilled rack of wild venison, with cranberry and herb sauce.

Cellaring

Careful cellaring for up to twenty years will reward those with patience.

Wine Summary

Only the finest parcels of our Cabernet are selected, and after crushing are hand plunged. Once pressed, the wine is matured in 100% new French Oak where it develops in complexity.
